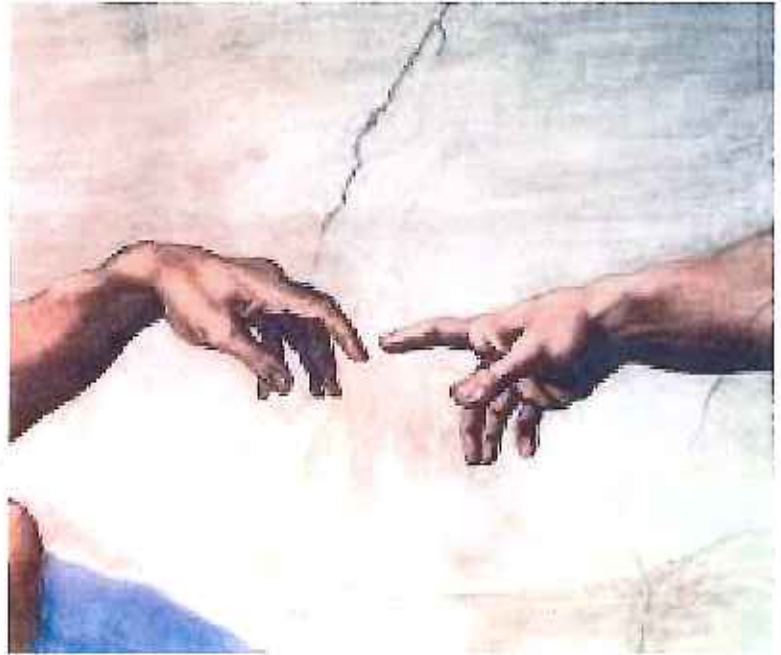

THE NEW ROMAN MISSAL

NEW WORDS....DEEPER MEANING

We continue our series on the new Roman Missal and the changes in the language we will use for Holy Eucharist beginning this Fall on the first Sunday of Advent. Today, we will look at the Creed.

The Creed (Latin: Credo) that most Americans proclaim at Mass is the Nicene Creed, and although sometimes the Baptismal Promises or Apostles' Creed is substituted, today's changes are about the translation of the Nicene Creed.



Right away, you will notice that the new translation begins with *I believe* and not *We believe*. "I believe" is a direct translation of the Latin word which begins the Creed, and fulfills the Church's desire that the vernacular translation mirror the original Latin as closely as possible.

Consubstantial with the Father is a tongue-twister phrase for many of us. In the entire revised translation of the Mass, this is probably the one phrase that will raise the most eyebrows. It replaces the expression *one in being with the Father*, and it describes the relationship between Jesus and the Father. The question of how Jesus relates to the Father has immense importance. Heresies have divided Christians over this very issue. Some of the early Councils of the Church carefully formulated a vocabulary that expresses the dogma of Jesus' divinity. The Latin word *consubstantialis* was the word used and *consubstantial* is its direct English equivalent. Consubstantial is a very unusual word. We don't use it for anything else. But it is describing a very unusual thing – the nature of Jesus Christ, and he is not like anything else.

Another change where the language of the new translation does make a difference is the phrase "(he...) *was incarnate of the Virgin Mary*" which implies not only the birth but conception of Jesus too. Incarnate means "Jesus became flesh". The mystery of how the Divine could become human is called the Incarnation. The current phrase simply says of Jesus "(he...) *was born of the Virgin Mary*".

There are also several other minor changes to the rest of the text of the Nicene Creed.

The official version of the Apostles' Creed has also been changed, but those changes too are minor. We Catholics tend to use the Apostles' Creed to begin the recitation of the rosary, and if you have never changed to the current translation to do that, the new translation will be remarkably the same as what you have been praying all along.
